As a designer and manufacturer of modular and mobile biosafety laboratories and products, CERTEK has always been at the forefront of biological safety and research. The mid-1990s marked the beginning of the company's modular laboratory division and in 1997 history was made when CERTEK placed the world's first modular laboratory on the roof of a five-story building for Louisiana State University in New Orleans.

Since then CERTEK has manufactured modular and mobile laboratories for universities, medical centers, military bases, and research laboratories both domestically and internationally. In the past CERTEK laboratories have been used to research Ebola, Avian Flu, SARS, and MERS. In the face of the COVID-19 pandemic CERTEK is rising to the occasion once again, providing researchers and health-care workers with the safe and innovative products and facilities that our clients have come to expect.

Recently CERTEK has collaborated with Duke Health and Novant Health to develop a decontamination chamber that can decontaminate small and large equipment, including N95 masks, on a large scale, and we delivered the CERTEK Mobile Decontamination Chamber (CMDC) in just 11 days.
